Application Forms	Your home institution needs to submit the <b>Online Nomination Form</b> to AIU, and then nominees will receive a username and password to access our Online Application System. Applicants are required to send the application forms and supporting documents by airmail in accordance with the guidelines on the website.

GPA Requirement	Applicants must have completed two semesters at an AIU partner institution <b>before applying</b> and have a cumulative GPA (Grade Point Average) of <b>2.50 (4.0 scale) or higher</b> .			
Level of English Proficiency Requirement	Applicants whose first language is NOT English are required to achieve a standard of TOEFL ® Test score 71 (iBT) or its equivalent, or IELTS score of 6.0 or equivalent. Student Visa Application Procedure	<ol> <li>Submit the following required supporting documents along with the application documents for AIU admission: Copy of Passport Proof of Financial Resources (See detailed instructions at the webpage below)</li> <li>After admission to AIU, each student must submit "Offer Acceptance and Immigration Information Form" online.</li> <li>The Center for International Affairs will submit the application for the Certificate of Eligibility (CoE) to the immigration office in order that admitted students can apply for the student visa and arrive on AIU campus by our official arrival day. (Please note that AIU may not be able to meet each student's request about the timing of issuance of CoE by the immigration office)</li> <li>The Center for International Affairs will send the CoE to the student's home institution.</li> <li>The student will apply for a visa by submitting the CoE with supporting documents to the nearest Japanese Embassy or Consulate.</li> <li>* Please refer to the following webpage: <u>http://web.aiu.ac.jp/en/short-term/semester-year-programs/how-to-apply/</u></li> </ol>
