Advising Syllabus

Mission Statement:

Academic advising at St. Mary's College of Maryland is dedicated to creating a collaborative relationship between a student and an academic advisor working to develop and achieve educational goals consistent with student interests, values, and abilities.

Advising helps students:

- 1. Discover academic, co-curricular, and career interests.
- 2. Identify appropriate courses and opportunities to achieve goals.
- 3. Evaluate strengths, challenges, and developmental needs.
- 4. Utilize available academic, co-curricular, and professional development opportunities.
- 5. Connect with campus resources to make informed decisions and identify sources of support.
- 6. Follow academic policies and procedures.

Advisees will:

Be proactive

- o Schedule regular appointments to meet with their advisor during the semester.
- o Contact advisor for special advising sessions when necessary, especially when experiencing academic difficulties.
- o Sign up as soon as Advising Week appointments are offered in order to be cleared for courses and receive permission to register.
- o Work with an advisor to create a realistic four-year graduation plan; assess plan and update as needed each semester while tracking course progress toward graduation.
- o Be ready to discuss personal, academic, career, and life goals.
- o Prepare for advising appointments by researching CORE and Major requirements needed. Create a list of potential classes for registration. See the OS3's Advising Day Prep Steps document for guidance.

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- o Think about what they would like to talk with their advisor about before the meeting. Make a list of topics, questions, and concerns.
- o Share their story and interests so their advisor will know what they want to get out of their St. Mary's experience:

Interested in studying abroad?	
Planning on completing a St. Mary's Project (SMP)?

Interested in doing an internship?
Ideas about what comes after SMCM?

o Acknowledge what they don't know and ask questions about what matters to them.

Follow through and follow up

- o Be open to considering ideas and recommendations made by their advisor.
- o Follow through on suggestions their advisor makes. If a suggestion doesn't make sense, ask for more detail.
- o Follow up on conversations regarding next steps.
- o Update their advisor about significant changes to academic, co-curricular, or career plans.

Determine their St. Mary's Experience

o Students control their destiny! Advisors will do their best to help students make informed decisions, but students are responsible for their academic choices and performance.

Advisors will:

- Provide information about the Core Curriculum, major degree requirements, and general graduation requirements.
- Help define academic, co-curricular, and career interests.
- Develop schedules and plans that allow students to meet academic, co-curricular, and career goals.
- Assist with academic problems or related difficulties (e.g., Academic Notice, Midterm Deficiencies).
- Offer advice and recommend support (e.g., academic coaching and support, Wellness Center, Writing and Speaking Center) as needed.
- Direct students to other resources if they can't answer questions.
- Keep records of all advisement sessions with notes on discussion and recommendations.
