At-A-Glance



The Bureau of Clinician Recruitment and Service (BCRS) coordinates the recruitment and retention of health professionals to work in communities in need. BCRS offers scholarship and loan repayment assistance programs for individuals committed to working in these Health Professional Shortage Areas (HPSAs). Each program requires a service commitment at an NHSC-approved health care site, Critical Shortage Facility, or educational institution in exchange for financial assistance.
