Critical research questions

Critical research questions

- What factors contribute to/facilitate engagement in aggressive behavior?

Critical research questions

Lab-specific skills: survey design, correlational research

Critical research questions

- How do parents' and teachers' socialization actions affect children's emotional competence?
- Do teachers use generalized response styles when dealing with children's emotions or are they sensitive to children's individual differences and needs?

Lab-specific skills: Monitoring and modulating electrical signals in the brain via EEG and tDCS. Neuropsychiatric assessments.

Critical research questions

- How does brain stimulation via tDCS affect performance on test of cognition and attention?
- Can we predict behavior by examining someone's brainwave patterns?
