Improving our Institution

Through the Energy Conservation Initiative, community members developed dozens of ideas for the college to **cut energy usage by up to 15%**-- many ideas are already being implemented or being used to craft our Climate Action Plan.

The housekeeping staff has switched to using cleaning products that are **people-and-environmentally friendly**.

We're no longer wasting so much water, food or money- the Great Room's gone "trayless." In surveys, "trayless" operation wastes 23% less food, and saves 250,000 gal of water annually.

Thanks largely to the work of the Grounds crew, SMCM is the **first**Maryland college to receive Audubon International's Certification in
Environmental Planning for our efforts to enhance the ecological
value of campus land.

The College now recycles 42% of its total waste.

Creating a Culture of Sustainability

Orientation Leaders and Residence Assistants were trained before the 08/09 year on how to promote sustainable living practices in the student body.

Sustainable living "Green Guides" for students, faculty and staff are now available.

The Committee **funded 75 students** to attend Power Shift 09, a national conference held to learn about sustainable initiatives and how to take political action.

Campus-wide events like **RiverFest**, **Recyclemania**, **the 3**rd **Polar Bear Splash** and community markets drew in a diverse array of community members.

The Committee co-hosted lectures by **Will Baker**, President of the Chesapeake Bay Foundation **& Davis Bookhart**, Manager of Energy Management and Environmental Stewardship in the Office of Facilities Management, Johns Hopkins University.

7 student composting coordinators were hired to maintain the expanded compost-drop-zones on campus.
