

# ANNUAL SUSTAINABILITY REPORT 2010-2011

## **Accomplishments:**

- Climate Action Plan
  - O Worked collaboratively with the SGA to increase the purchase of renewable energy credits by 15% without the need for additional funds
  - Completed the first update of the College's green house gas inventory in August 2011
- Green St. Mary's Revolving Fund (GSMRF)
  - Worked collaboratively with Student Affairs and the SGA to establish a \$110,000 rotating fund
  - Established the first working committee for project reviews and proposals in October 2010 (Committee contained 3 students, 2 faculty, and 2 staff members)
  - Finalized all charter documents and project submission forms
  - o Obtained funding for 4 energy conservation projects totaling \$6,000
- St. Mary's' Strategic Plan
  - Worked with the Strategic Planning Committee for the draft of Vital Priority F (Sustainability)
- STARS (Sustainability Tracking Assessment & Rating System)
  - St. Mary's registered as a STARS participant and intends to submit the College's first ever comprehensive green report in Fall '11
- Reusable To-Go Program
  - Worked with Student Environmental Action Committee and Bon Appétit to design a pilot program, which began in February 2011
  - Ordered 1,000 reusable "oyster-shell" to-go boxes for 400 initial participants
  - Expanded the program to 400 new participants and added a new drop off station at the Campus Pub in September 2011
- Campus Farm
  - o Applied for and received a \$1,000 grant from Sandy Hollow Arts and Recreation for the Environment to purchase farm materials
  - O Assisted in organizing a summer intern structure to maintain the farms productivity through peak harvesting seasons
- Composting, Waste Minimization and Recycling
  - Expanded the SGA-funded composting program to include pickup of coffee grounds from the Daily Grind and the Green Bean cafes
  - Hosted 2 "Free Markets" during the academic year, collecting unwanted consumer goods and offering them for free at selected events
  - Worked with student organizations to improve signage at composting stations and recycling containers around campus
  - Organized an end of year residence hall donation drive collecting 2 box trucks worth of food, clothing, school supplies, furniture, appliances, ect. which were then donated to charity

- Campus recycling rates decreased to 35% from 40% of total waste, based upon new measurement methodologies
- New Student Orientation
  - Worked with the Orientation staff to distribute green guides to the incoming firstyear and transfer students
  - Conducted "Green" outreach trainings with residence life staff and orientation leaders
